You will learn how your school can incorporate the school-wide Enrichment Model of education. ou will be taught "step by step" how to develop, create and implement successful Student Driven Enrichment Clusters. You will learn about scheduling, budgeting, and tapping into resources. You will walk away feeling knowledgeable and full of practical ideas to bring back to your school. TAOTS provides enrichment opportunities for ALL students by growing students' ideas, tapping into their interests, and cultivating their talents resulting in G EA for ALL students. TAOTS is a NYC public elementary school educating a diverse group of students from the Bensonhurst/Bay Ridge area of Brooklyn, New York. TAOTS continues to thrive because of the strong foundation that was created and laid out by the school's founding principal, Josephine Sportella-Giusto, in her 2008 NYCDOE New School Proposal. TAOTS has become one of C's most sought after public elementary schools. ith an overall student population of 400 students, TAOTS receives over 500 kindergarten applications yearly with only 50 seats to offer.

SESSION DESCRIPTION: Engage, Empower, Achieve - Strategies for Implementing Close Reading and Text Analysis. The Close Reading Protocol strategy asks students to read and reread a te t carefully and purposefully. hen students "close read," they focus on what the author has to say, what the author's purpose is, what the words mean, and what the structure of the text tells us. his approach ensures that students really understand what they've read. strategies for students to carefully investigate a text to make connections to essential questions about history, human behavior, and ourselves. Skillful close reading is also an important foundation for helping students develop the ability to justify their claims in class discussions and writing assignments with specific evidence. Analysis will be done on close reading activity that use some or all the steps of (1) Read Aloud Text: The teacher or a confident student reader can read the text aloud. Students should follow along with the reading. Students will be asked to circle unfamiliar words as they listen. After the read-aloud, as students share these words with the class, the group may decide which words to define immediately to limit confusion and which definitions you want students to uncover through careful reading for their students, (2) The group will then proceed to analyze how students then may read silently and note specific word or phrases that jump out to them for any number of reasons to then develop into questions the teacher may ask students to think about from what they have read. (3) Teachers will be giving information on how to arrange small groups, have students read the text in chunks and answer a set of text-dependent questions. Text-dependent questions are those that can be answered based only on careful analysis of the text itself. (4) Ideas on having students create a visual image of what the essence of the text is about, and (5) then create a gallery walk of those images, and lastly, (6) lead discussions of text and collaborate on the information gathered from the previous 5 activities.



This session will offer suggestions for effective PD from the book *Platinum Principals Making Your School A #1 Hit*. The session will include tips and handouts for successfully implementing effective and useful Professional Development. Recognitions include National Blue Ribbon School, Lighthouse Blue Ribbon School, and Alabama Banner School. Additionally, the distinguished Terrell Bell Award in Leadership was presented to Ms. Alexander by the United State Secretary of Education during her tenue as principal.

This doesn't feel real-world and relevant to many students and zaps their interest. Students who graduate from an AP Computer Science class don't have several critical skills (like interacting with 3rd party data sources) to make a useful product. Nikil Ragav, winner of the University of Pennsylvania's President's Innovation Prize and founder of inventXYZ, discusses an alternate approach where students design, build, and code real-world products with technical support from real-world experts. This session will show you how students can learn how to:

- Recreate a historical empire as a video game using Unreal Engine in World History.
 This is the same tool used to create Fortnite.
- Build and code electronic music instruments in Algebra, where they they realize that imaginary numbers and sine waves are useful!
- Use cameras and AI in Physics to analyze the forces and torque on their joints as they
 play sports to improve their technique. Similar techniques are used in the NFL and in
 sports medicine for injured athlete-recovery team programs.
- Use data science and an industry tool called Tableau in Language Arts to visualize trends across 100,000 data points on topics they care about (such as sneaker sales, social media influencers, crime, housing prices) and then write a blog article using interactive data visualizations to substantiate their claims.

All-in-all, each of these experiences are designed to introduce students to a tool and use-case from industry and prepare students for jobs that pay \$100k-\$220k/yr.

SESSION DESCRIPTION: Parental Engagement Investing, "Maximum R.O.I". There is substantial evidence to support the idea that parent's involvement in children's learning (e.g., discussing children's schoolwork, attending parent-teacher conferences, collaborating with teachers on how to best support their child) facilitates children's learning and ultimately their success (Pomerantz & Moorman, 2010). Parent involvement must be clearly defined for parents and teachers to eliminate the gap in understanding what involvement looks like at the school level. The schools and district team must begin to develop an Action Team Partnership to initiate a plan for volunteers (Epstein et al., 2018). Mapp et al. (2017) found parents are more receptive to engagement when they feel fully implored to get involved through intentional methods that demonstrate the school's willingness to include parents in the school. A framework must be established to develop a comprehensive plan to bring the school and community together. By the end of this session, participants will have: an understanding of parent engagement; know how to build connections with parents/families; have tools to support the implementation of Parent Engagement Framework; know how to support teachers in building collaborative relationships with families; have strategies in your toolbox to support parent engagement; have ideas on how to collect data on your current state of engagement; have strategies to support you with creating a welcoming environment for all families; develop parent engagement goals for your school community, and learn about early literacy resources to support families.



It s the story of walking into what looks from the outside like a "good" school - Is considered an A school by state standards (but barely an A at 90%) which is arguably a harder place to start from than a failing (turnaround) school because the possibility of falling is huge - especially with too many "new items like new curriculum and new school system. Your goal as an administrator is to keep the good stuff while deleting the waste to push the entire organization higher. This is accomplished by addressing the personal social emotional needs through Leader in Me (LIM) and the academics through Precision Teaching for learning. LIM gives a voice and personal control over their successes, builds self-efficacy, positive attitude, decreases discipline, improves attendance, and improves overall performance for both students and teachers. Precision teaching using data, solid curriculum, and creative scheduling to revise the RTI process, introduce Walk to Intervention, dedicated Reading block, integrate Math foundation standards into hands on STEAM and Green lessons. All these pieces work together to give teachers and students the tools they need to push students from high to higher.

Think that your phonics instruction is over once students can blend short words? Think again High uality literacy instruction "closes the deal" teaching students to decode and understand "big words," right from the start. his pivotal "under the radar" skill is essential for reaching the levels of comprehension that are e pected in the intermediate grades. Participants will leave this session equipped with a) information about how word parts of big words work (syllables and morphemes); b) a scope and sequence for teaching word parts, with special attention to addressing appropriate parts, K-1; c) strategies and techni ues for teaching the many different word parts that advance students' decoding and understanding (e.g., inflections, derivational morphemes, bound roots, compounds, affixes). Significant emphasis will be placed on appropriate practice that "adds in" elements without replacing high quality phonics instruction in single syllable words.


